Included in our conversations with stakeholders during our LCAP engagement process, we have discussed the topics of student academic as well as social emotional needs due to the pandemic. This has taken place during staff meetings, meetings with union representation, site council, DELAC meeting and with PTA/O's and community during open Q&A periods of our monthly Board Meetings. More information about this Plan will be shared at our annual May input meeting for all stakeholders to give further input on how to best serve our students.

Students who are low income, English Learners, foster youth, homeless students, students with disabilities, students at risk of abuse, neglect, or exploitation, disengaged students, and students who are below grade level, including but not limited to, those who did not enroll in kindergarten in the 2020-21 school year, and other students identified by certificated staff shall be assessed with our SBAC testing in the Spring of 2021 along with local assessments (DIBELS, Accelerated Reader, Math Expressions). The social emotional needs of our students will be assessed by our counselors and counseling intern program staff and will include counselor, teacher/principal and parent referrals.

Parents and Guardians of students will be notified through the District's communication plan that includes but is not limited to revised websites, Social Media, weekly districtwide information videos, teacher meetings, District-wide Zoom staff meetings, along with newsletters and through direct parent contacts.

For students identified as those needing support, we will encourage students to attend summer sessions, after school tutorials and we will provide intervention teachers and para-educators to assist in small group instructional support.
